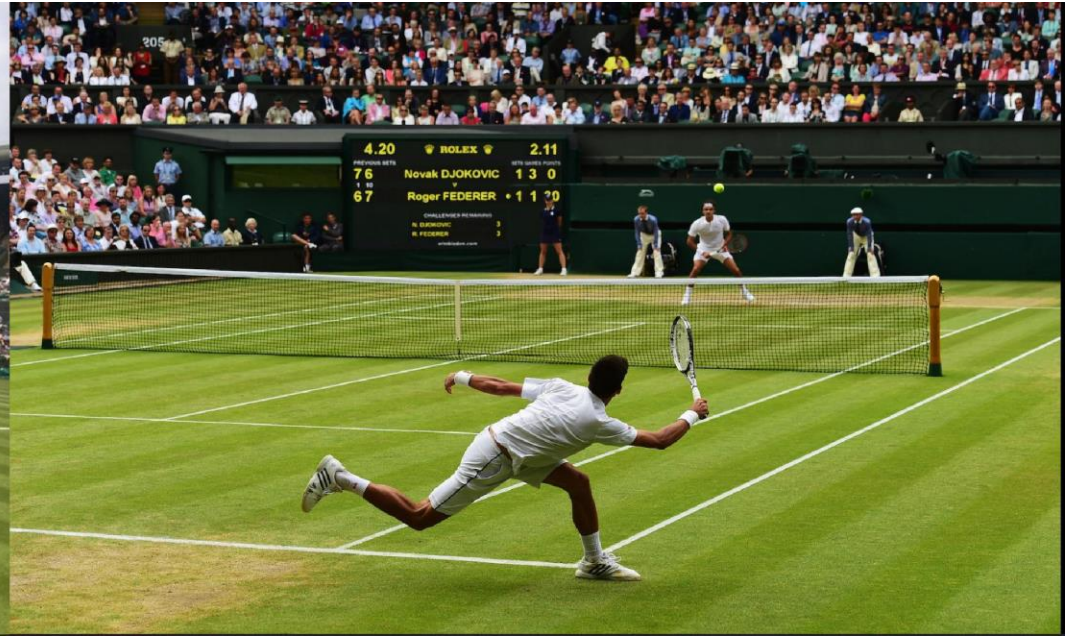


Stadium size

The field is 23 by 11 meters wide and the playing field is made of grass.

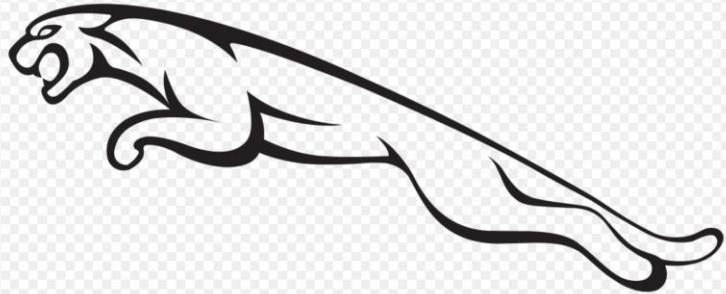

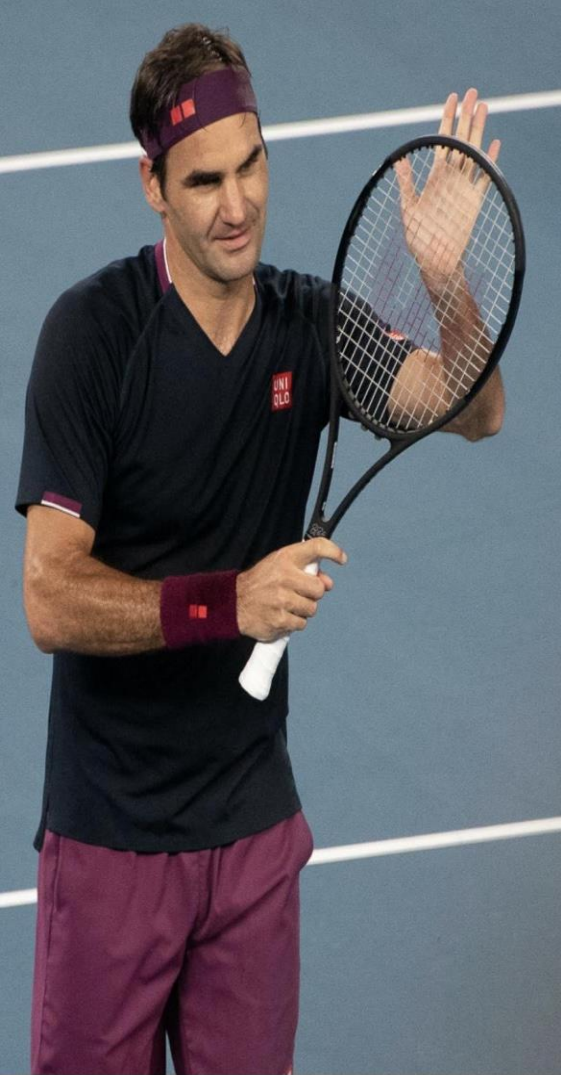

Martina Navratilova won this tournament 4 times and she is the tennis player who won it the most for women and for man is Federer With 8 trophies





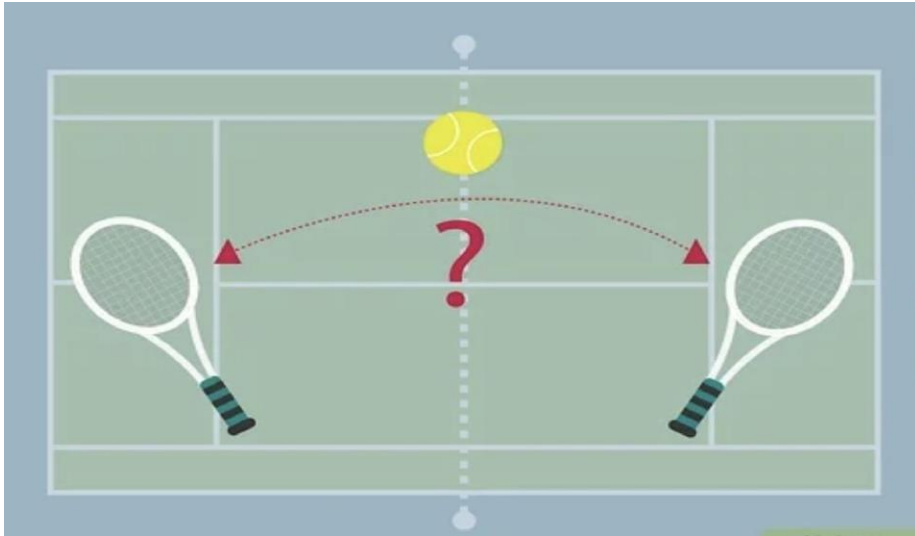
TENNIS
